Copyright Infringement Policy and Sanctions

Trenz Beauty Academy does not allow the unauthorized use of copyrighted material. Peer-to-peer (P2P) file sharing programs are not permitted on premises for users of Trenz Beauty Academy's computer network. A peer-to-peer file sharing program is any computer application that alters a personal computer into a storage server that can distribute data to other computers simultaneously.

Copyrighted materials cannot be shared by any means, including network file shares, the internet, illegal upload/download, and is not limited to just peer-to-peer programs. Copyright infringement, according to the U.S. Copyright Office, is when "a copyrighted work is reproduced, performed, publicly displayed, or made without the permission of the copyright owner." This pertains to a portion or all of a copyright work. Unauthorized peer-to-peer file sharing and unauthorized distribution of any copyrighted material may be subject to civil and criminal liabilities. In general, anyone found liable for civil copyright infringement may be ordered to pay either actual damages or "statutory" damages affixed at not less than \$750 and not more than \$30,000 per work infringed. For "willful" infringement, a court may award up to \$150,000 per work infringed. A court can, in its discretion, also assess costs and attorneys' fees. For details, see Title 17, United States Code, Sections 504, 505. Willful copyright infringement can also result in criminal penalties, including imprisonment of up to five years and fines of up to \$250,000 per offense. Unauthorized distribution of copyrighted material, including unauthorized peer-to-peer file sharing, may subject them to civil and criminal liabilities.

If an individual is found to be illegally distributing copyrighted material (Peer-to-peer sharing) using any Trenz Beauty Academy's computing resources, disciplinary action will be taken as outlined below:

- 1st Offense: Students will be put on Continuous Probation. This means the student will be put on probation for the remainder of their program.
- 2nd Offense: Student will be terminated from the program.
